

## **ASB Post-Survey Summary**

Spring 2008

Method: Paper & Pencil  
Population: ASB participants

96 Respondents  
96 Completed (100%)

### **Sites**

13.54% (13) Pt. Reyes, CA – Environmental  
9.38% (9) Arcata, CA – Environmental  
9.38% (9) San Juan, UT – Environmental  
14.58% (14) Seattle, WA – Hunger & Homelessness  
11.46% (11) San Francisco, CA – HIV/AIDS & Poverty  
14.58% (14) Portland, OR – Urban Planning  
12.50% (12) San Diego, CA – Immigration  
14.58% (14) Los Angeles, CA – HIV/AIDS

### **Item Responses**

90.63% (87) of respondents reported that ASB staff provided adequate preparation/training prior to their trip.

93.76% (90) of respondents reported that there was sufficient space in the van used to travel to their ASB site.

91.67% (88) of respondents reported that in general, the lodging for their ASB trip was adequate.

96.84% (92) of respondents reported feeling that their student site leader performed well in her/his role.

100% (91) of respondents reported feeling that their staff partner performed well in her/his role.

92.31% (84) of respondents reported that the service agency with which they worked provided adequate training/preparation for their service project.

97.92% (94) of respondents reported feeling that their service experience provided through ASB was meaningful.

90.63% (87) of respondents reported that on looking back, they felt prepared for their experience prior to their trip.

97.92% (94) of respondents reported that their overall knowledge regarding their service issue increased as a result of their ASB experience.

86.46% (83) of respondents reported that their attitude toward their ASB site issue has changed as a result of their experience on their trip.

76.04% (73) of respondents reported feeling that the alcohol and drug-free component of ASB enhanced the overall experience for participants.

78.13% (75) of respondents reported that this ASB experience has had an impact on their future academic plans/goals.

68.48% (63) of respondents reported that this ASB experience has had an impact on their future career plans/goals.

87.50% (84) of respondents reported that as a result of their ASB trip, they are more likely to volunteer/engage in community service in the future.

89.58% (86) of respondents reported feeling safe while travelling on site.

89.24% (83) of respondents reported feeling safe while travelling en-route.

96.84% (92) of respondents reported feeling safe in the lodging on site.

88.42% (84) of respondents reported feeling safe in the lodging en-route.

97.90% (93) of respondents reported feeling safe regarding their service agency.

97.92% (94) of respondents reported feeling safe regarding their work environment.

68.75% (11) of respondents (16 respondents only for this item) reported feeling safe regarding "other". When asked to specify "Other", responses included:

- Everything
- Everything-extra time-etc.
- I don't know what you mean by that
- Moving heavy boxes
- People on trip
- Personal belongings
- Safe environment
- Staff and group
- Students driving
- Tiffany's driving
- Walking around the city
- With group

General comments regarding safety included:

Driving (Driving in inclement weather, Unsafe drivers, Unfamiliar roads)  
Lodging (Motel 6 was scary)  
Site safety (Toxic/dangerous materials at rebuilding center)

When asked what part of their ASB experience had the greatest impact on them, some common themes emerged:

Developing relationships/Interacting with/Learning from other trip members  
Becoming more informed regarding the particular site issue  
Experience with service agencies  
Direct experience/contact with clients at service agencies.

When asked what 1 or 2 experiences they will take away from their trip, these themes emerged:

Friendships and group experience  
Knowledge of issues  
Service experience  
Personal growth experiences  
Fun/Sightseeing experiences

When asked how their trip measured up to their pre-trip expectations, most responses indicated participants' expectations were met or exceeded.

When asked what they would change about their ASB experience and why, responses involved the following themes:

Nothing  
Increase service time/activity  
Increase reflection/discussion time  
More preparation/organization  
More direct contact with clients/people being helped  
Different lodging arrangements  
More free time
