

## Financial Aid CIS Survey SP07 Summary

21.43% of undergraduate respondents reported taking 6-8 credit hours

78.57% of undergraduate respondents reported taking 12+ credit hours

54.55% of graduate respondents reported taking 5-8 credit hours

45.45% of graduate respondents reported taking 9+ credit hours

44% of respondents reported not working

20% reported working 1-29 hours per week

36% reported working 30+ hours per week

12% of respondents identified themselves as athletes

When asked how often they used the CIS for any purpose, respondents reported:

24% Daily

16% At least once a week

24% At least once a month

32% When I register or pay tuition

4% Never

73.91% of respondents reported they were at least “somewhat comfortable” using CIS

When asked how frequently they used CIS to check their financial aid status, respondents reported:

- 4.35% Daily
- 17.39% At least once a week
- 26.09% At least once a month
- 52.17% When I register or pay tuition

When asked about their reaction to the new policy of using the Umail system for all financial aid correspondence:

- 29.17% had positive reactions
- 37.50% responded with questions about this policy or complaints about the Umail system

When asked to indicate their interest level in participating in an information session, 39.13% responded not interested. Again, a few of the respondents did not answer the question, but responded with additional questions about the info session.
