Title of Assessment: High School Counselor Conference 2009

Population for Survey: 128 high school counselors who attended conference

Response Rate: 43.7%

Summary of key findings:

- 50.91% strongly agreed that the conference provided them with relevant information with respect to their students while 49.09% agreed.
- 43.64% strongly agreed that they got clear responses from University representatives while
 52.73% said they agreed.
- When rating the Admissions breakout session, 50.91% said excellent and 38.18% said good and 7.27% said fair.
- When rating the Financial Aid/ Scholarships breakout session, 58.49% said excellent and 33.96% said good and 5.66% said fair.
- When rating the College of Education breakout session, 18.92% said excellent and 2.7% said good.
- When rating the UHEAA breakout session, 37.50% said excellent and 10% said good.
- When rating the College of Mines and Earth Sciences breakout session, 2.94% said excellent and 5.88% said good.
- When rating the College of Humanities breakout session, 19.44% said excellent and 8.33% said good.
- When rating the Honors College breakout session, 65.96% said excellent and 17.02% said good.
- When rating the LEAP breakout session, 70% said excellent and 14% said good and 2% said fair
- 45.24% of people rated the student panel excellent and 35.71% said it was good and 16.67 said it was fair and 2.38% said it was poor.
- 79.25% said the conference met their expectations, 9.43% said it exceed their expectations while 5.66% said it fell short and 5.66% said they had none.
- 64.81% strongly agreed that they felt confident about the accuracy of the information they received while 31.48% agreed and 1 person strongly disagreed.

Actions Taken:

Based on the findings, the breakout sessions were successful and relevant. We have continued this format. We have also added tabling session during lunch so the counselors can meet with more departments and colleges on campus. We moved the conference to the union because of space, which was one of the main concerns of this conference. We decided not include the student panel this year based on the percentage of people that did not think it was excellent or good.
