Shoshone/Goshute Youth Summer Program Pre, Post, and Mini-Evals

Brief description of program:

SYLAP (Shoshone Goshute Youth Leadership Apprenticeship Program) targets high school age students who are Shoshone or Goshute to come to campus for a 6 week period or so. During that time they work to preserve their language by doing different projects on campus as well as learn about the opportunities available to them at the University of Utah.

Who was asked to complete survey: The Shoshone Goshute high school students attending the sessions

How many people were asked? Anywhere between 12 and 15.

Administration Type: Paper

Summary of Key Findings:

The students largely enjoyed visiting and meeting with people from various campus departments. They came in with very little if any understanding about the University of Utah, financial aid, scholarships, choosing a major, and on campus student clubs and organizations and left with a much greater understanding of how to be admitted to the University of Utah, how to fund your education, and how to create a schedule that allows for study time and time to join clubs and organizations on campus.

Actions Taken:

Preparing a similar schedule of activities for next year.
